We are extremely excited to be developing the early years outdoor environment to provide our youngest children with a stimulating, attractive and engaging environment to support their development.

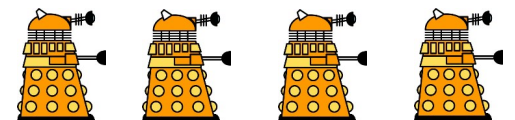

## Safe and Courteous Parking

A reminder to please be mindful of our neighbours when parking vehicles at drop off and pick up times.

We often get complaints in school from local residents who are unable to get out of their driveways due to inconsiderate parking.

Please remember to park in a safe and legal place.

Below are a few guidance notes from the Highway Code:-

“You **MUST NOT** park on a crossing or in the area covered by the zig-zag lines.

You should take extra care where the view of either side of the crossing is blocked by queuing traffic or incorrectly parked vehicles. Pedestrians may be crossing between stationary vehicles.

You **MUST NOT** park in parking spaces reserved for specific users, such as Blue Badge holders, residents or motorcycles, unless entitled to do so.

You **MUST NOT** leave your vehicle in a dangerous position or where it causes any unnecessary obstruction of the road.

**DO NOT** stop or park:

- \* near a school entrance
- \* anywhere you would prevent access for Emergency Services
- \* in front of an entrance to a property”

The next cross country race is this Saturday, 19th November at Concord Park. This is a new venue for the primary cross country. Please take a look at the SFSS website for further details.

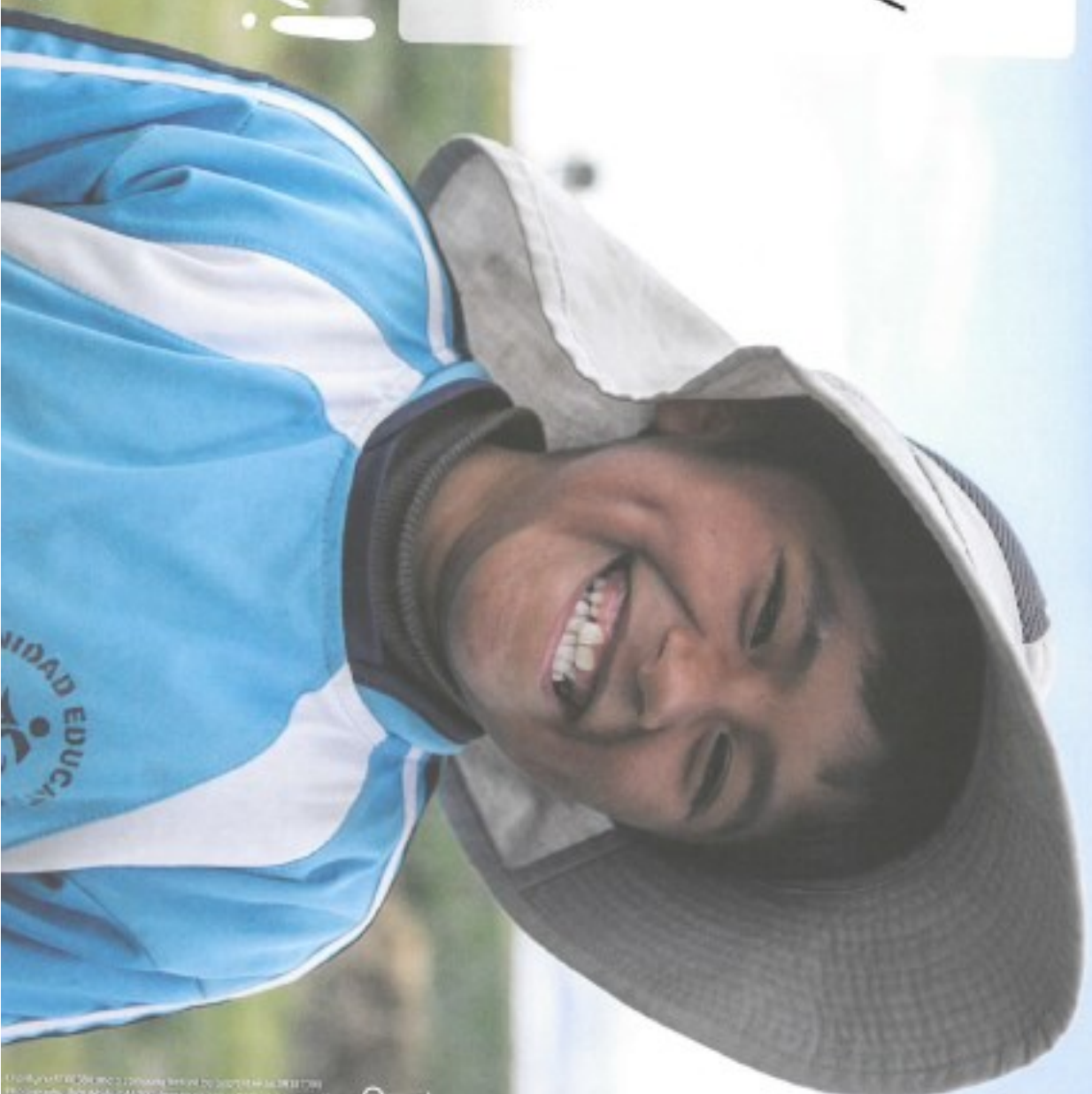
